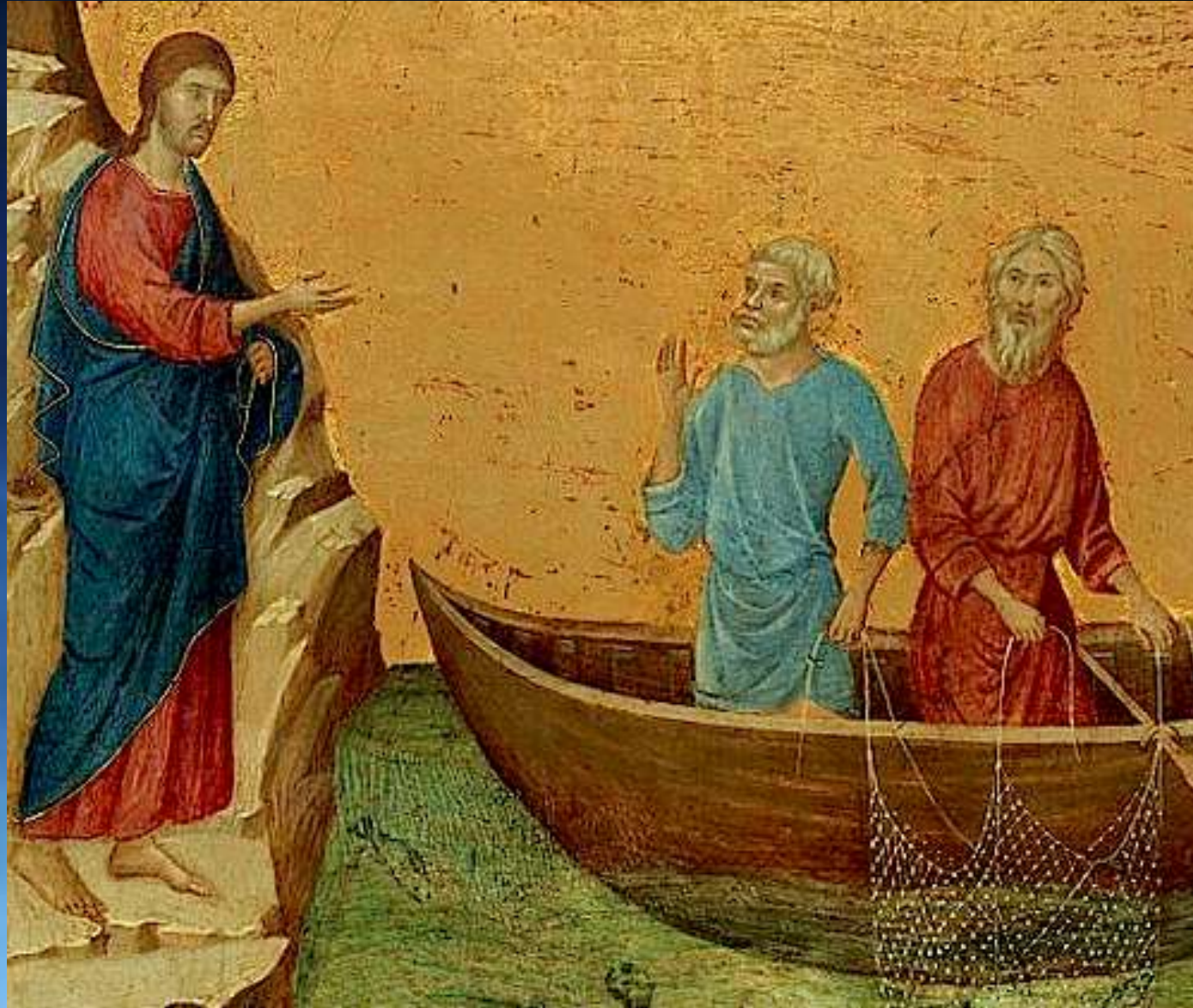
John 6:1-15 (ESV): “After this Jesus went away to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, which is the Sea of Tiberias. **2** And a large crowd was following him, because they saw the signs that he was doing on the sick. **3** Jesus went up on the mountain, and there he sat down with his disciples. **4** Now the Passover, the feast of the Jews, was at hand. **5** Lifting up his eyes, then, and seeing that a large crowd was coming toward him, Jesus said to Philip, ‘Where are we to buy bread, so that these people may eat?’ **6** He said this to test him, for he himself knew what he would do....”

“...**7** Philip answered him, ‘Two hundred denarii worth of bread would not be enough for each of them to get a little.’ **8** One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to him, **9** ‘There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish, but what are they for so many?’ **10** Jesus said, ‘Have the people sit down.’ Now there was much grass in the place. So the men sat down, about five thousand in number. **11** Jesus then took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated. So also the fish, as much as they wanted....”

“...**12** And when they had eaten their fill, he told his disciples, ‘Gather up the leftover fragments, that nothing may be lost.’ **13** So they gathered them up and filled twelve baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves left by those who had eaten. **14** When the people saw the sign that he had done, they said, ‘This is indeed the Prophet who is to come into the world!’ **15** Perceiving then that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, Jesus withdrew again to the mountain by himself.”



John 1:38-42 (ESV): “Jesus turned and saw them following and said to them, ‘What are you seeking?’ And they said to him, ‘Rabbi’ (which means Teacher), ‘where are you staying?’ **39** He said to them, ‘Come and you will see.’ So they came and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day, for it was about the tenth hour. **40** One of the two who heard John speak and followed Jesus was Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother. **41** He first found his own brother Simon and said to him, ‘We have found the Messiah’ (which means Christ). **42** He brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, ‘You are Simon the son of John. You shall be called Cephas’ (which means Peter).”

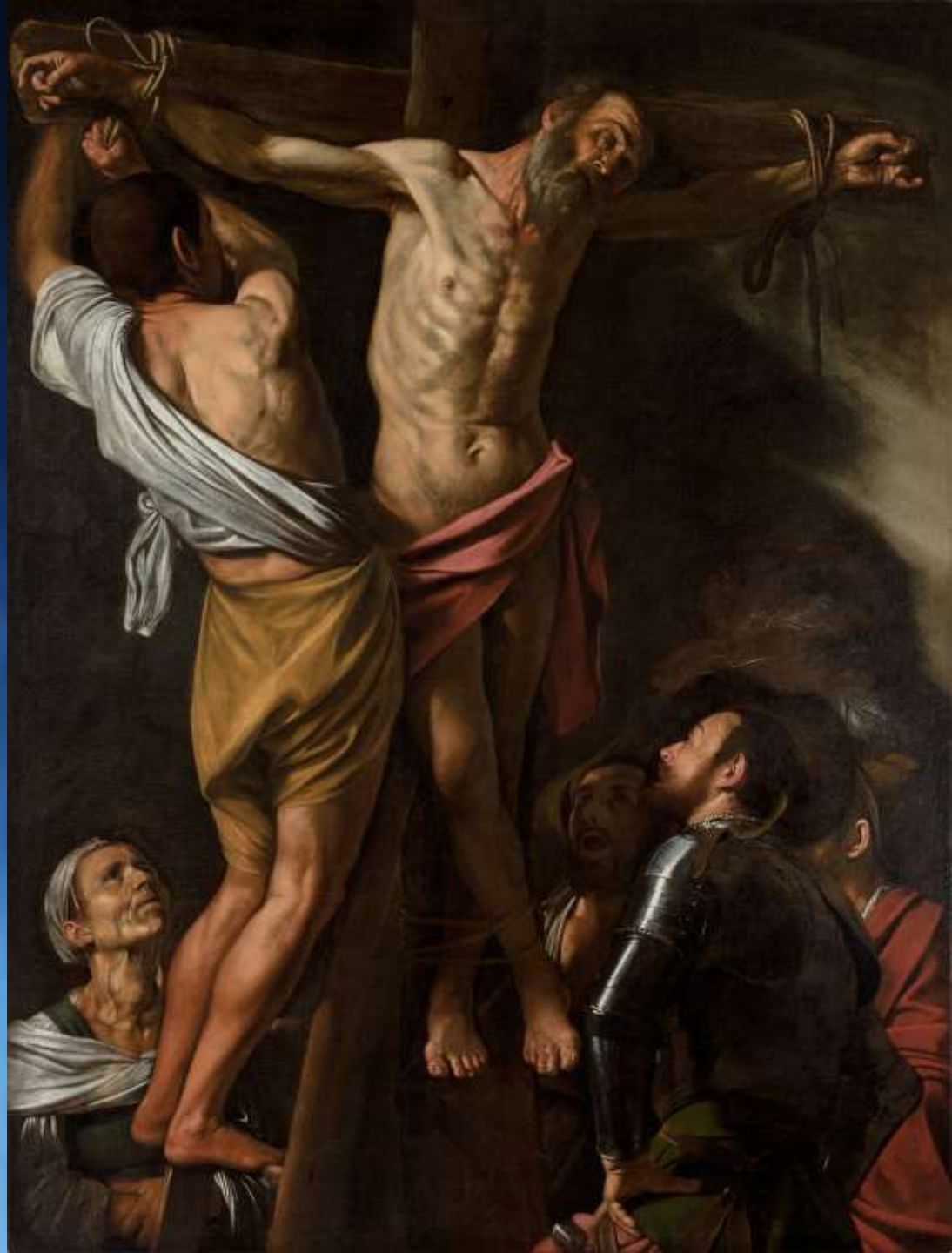


Mark 1:16-18 (ESV): “Passing alongside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew the brother of Simon casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen. **17** And Jesus said to them, ‘Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men.’ **18** And immediately they left their nets and followed him.”

Mark 1:29 (ESV): “And immediately he left the synagogue and entered the house of Simon and Andrew.”

John 1:45-46 (ESV): “The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, ‘Follow me.’ 44 Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter.”

John 12:20-22 (ESV): “Now among those who went up to worship at the feast were some Greeks. **21** So these came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, ‘Sir, we wish to see Jesus.’ **22** Philip went and told Andrew; Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus.”





Matthew 15:32 (ESV): “Then Jesus called his disciples to him and said, ‘I have compassion on the crowd because they have been with me now three days and have nothing to eat. And I am unwilling to send them away hungry, lest they faint on the way.’”





Mark 8:18-21 (ESV): “Having eyes do you not see, and having ears do you not hear? And do you not remember? **19** When I broke the five loaves for the five thousand, how many baskets full of broken pieces did you take up?’ They said to him, ‘Twelve.’ **20** ‘And the seven for the four thousand, how many baskets full of broken pieces did you take up?’ And they said to him, ‘Seven.’ **21** And he said to them, ‘Do you not yet understand?’”



John 6:8-9 (NIV): “Another of his disciples,
Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother, spoke up,
9 ‘Here is a boy with five small barley
loaves and two small fish, but how far will
they go among so many?’”

MAIN POINT

Luke 17:5-6 (ESV): “The apostles said to the Lord, ‘Increase our faith!’ 6 And the Lord said, ‘If you had faith like a grain of mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, “Be uprooted and planted in the sea,” and it would obey you.’”

1 John 5:14 (ESV): “And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us.”

James 2:26 (ESV): “For as the body apart from the spirit is dead, so also faith apart from works is dead.”

Romans 4:5 (ESV): “To the one who does not work but believes in him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is counted as righteousness.”

Romans 3:23-25 (ESV): “For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, **24** and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, **25** whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith.”
