MANILA FIELDS RAVAGED

Ports and Installations Hit
Hard—Enemy Lines to Leyte

Manila, Nov. 7.—An-

Franklin Delano Roosevelt, who
broke more than a century-old tradi-
tion in 1900 when he was elected to
a third term as President, made
another political record yesterday
when he was chosen for a fourth
term by a heavy electoral but much
narrower popular majority over
Thomas E. Dewey, Governor of
New York.

At 7:35 A. M. Governor Dewey
announced Mr. Roosevelt's re-
election, ending his last wishes by
radio, in which the President,
quietly responded with an appreciative
telegram.

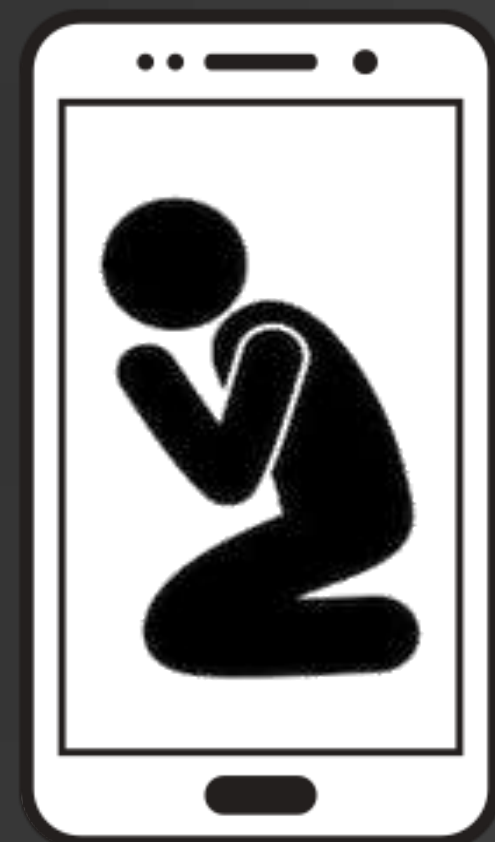

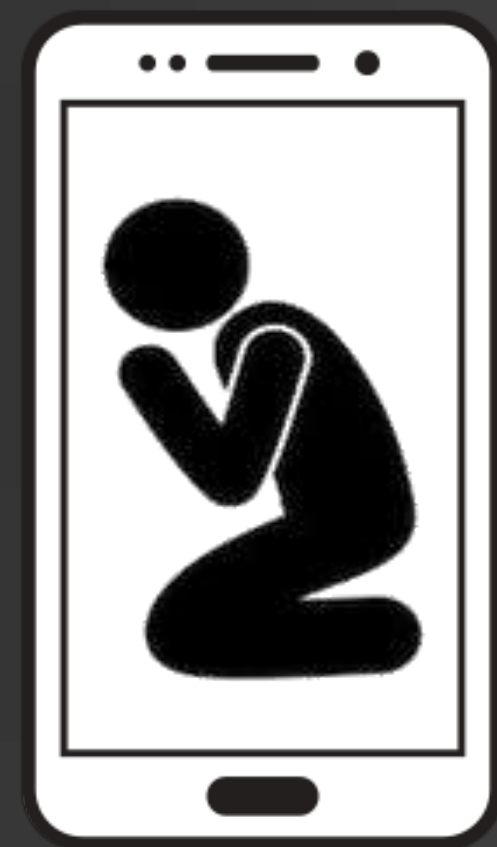

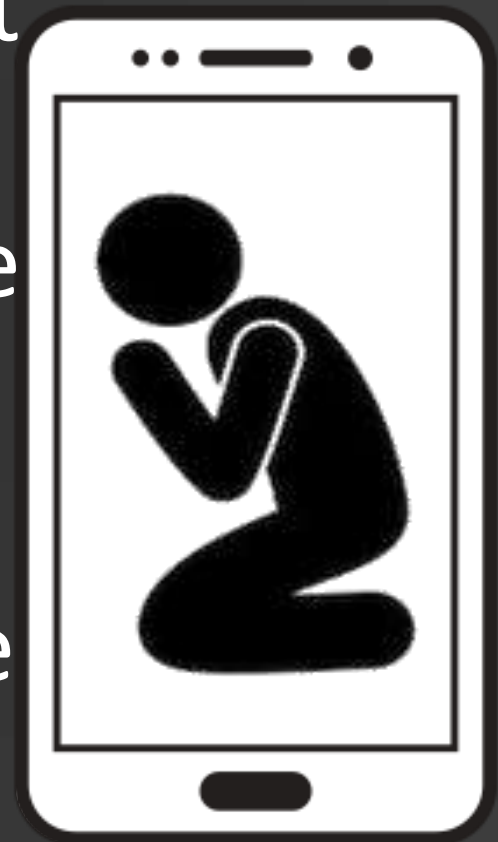
