

















GIRL SPRINTER IS INJURED IN PLANE CRASH

Athletic Career of Betty Robinson Shattered,

CHICAGO, June 29.—Betty Rebinson, winner of the 100-meter dash for women in the 1928 Olympic, today lay critically injured—her athletic career probably shattered by an airplane accident.

The 19-year old Northwestern university student yesterday suffered injuries that at first were believed fatal when a plane in which she was riding fell from about 400 feet. The plane was piloted by her cousin, Wilson Palmer, who also was critically injured.

Miss Robinson suffered fractures of her left leg, left arm, right hip and possibly a skull fracture. An X-ray examination was to be made this morning to determine if she

had been internally injured.

The accident occurred over an abandoned airport and was witnessed by parents of both victims of the tracedy.

Miss Robinson tecame a member of the 1925 women's olympic team when she was only 16 years old. She had made sensational marks as a member of the Illinois women's athletic club, and in the international games, won the United States' first track victory. She set a world women's record for 100-meters at 12 seconds, and retained it until she was beaten by Stella Waish at Dallas, Tex., a year sheep.

Her condition is critical. Her physician indicated she never would be able to run again.

"...Judah was in Chezib when she bore him. 6 And Judah took a wife for Er his firstborn, and her name was Tamar. 7 But Er, Judah's firstborn, was wicked in the sight of the LORD, and the LORD put him to death. 8 Then Judah said to Onan, 'Go in to your brother's wife and perform the duty of a brother-in-law to her, and raise up offspring for your brother.' 9 But Onan knew that the offspring would not be his...."

"...So whenever he went in to his brother's wife he would waste the semen on the ground, so as not to give offspring to his brother. 10 And what he did was wicked in the sight of the LORD, and he put him to death also. 11 Then Judah said to Tamar his daughter-in-law, 'Remain a widow in your father's house, till Shelah my son grows up' – for he feared that he would die, like his brothers. So Tamar went and remained in her father's house."





Deuteronomy 25:5-6 (ESV): "If brothers" dwell together, and one of them dies and has no son, the wife of the dead man shall not be married outside the family to a stranger. Her husband's brother shall go in to her and take her as his wife and perform the duty of a husband's brother to her. 6 And the first son whom she bears shall succeed to the name of his dead brother, that his name may not be blotted out of Israel."

Genesis 38:12-19 (ESV): "In the course of time the wife of Judah, Shua's daughter, died. When Judah was comforted, he went up to Timnah to his sheepshearers, he and his friend Hirah the Adullamite. 13 And when Tamar was told, 'Your father-in-law is going up to Timnah to shear his sheep,' 14 she took off her widow's garments and covered herself with a veil, wrapping

herself up, and sat at the entrance to Enaim, which is on the road to Timnah...."

"...For she saw that Shelah was grown up, and she had not been given to him in marriage. 15 When Judah saw her, he thought she was a prostitute, for she had covered her face. 16 He turned to her at the roadside and said, 'Come, let me come in to you,' for he did not know that she was his daughter-in-law. She said, 'What will you give me, that you may come in to me?'..."

"...17 He answered, 'I will send you a young goat from the flock.' And she said, 'If you give me a pledge, until you send it -' 18 He said, 'What pledge shall I give you?' She replied, 'Your signet and your cord and your staff that is in your hand.' So he gave them to her and went in to her, and she conceived by him. 19 Then she arose and went away, and taking off her veil she put on the garments of her widowhood."






Genesis 38:24-25 (ESV): "About three months later Judah was told, 'Tamar your daughter-in-law has been immoral.

Moreover, she is pregnant by immorality.'
